Working Concepts for SS Cooperation

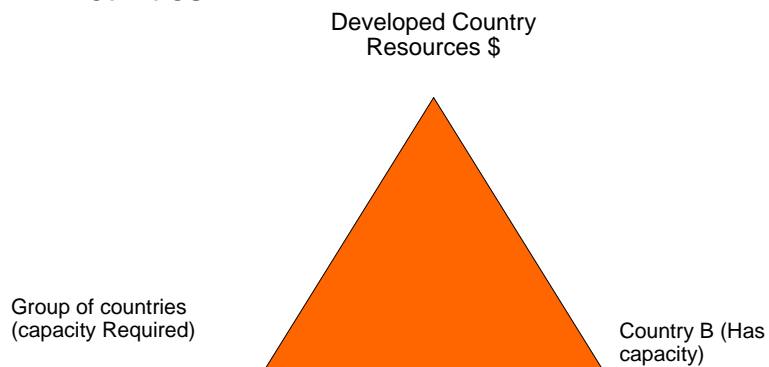
- TCDC
