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II. Sampling Design

- 1000 respondents
- Average household size is 5, thus, about 333 sample households will be interviewed
- Select highly urbanized area, in this case, Metro Manila (with diversified characteristics) and a typical provincial setting, in this case, Pampanga which is about 120 kms away from Manila





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II. Sampling Design

- 2/3 of the total sample hhs will be selected in Metro Manila and 1/3 for Pampanga
- In Metro Manila, sample villages will be selected according to the level of income and suspected high incidence of disabled persons. In this case, 3 villages will be selected. Based on equal allocation of sample households in these 3 villages, there will be 75 hhs per village.



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- For Pampanga, 2 villages will be selected, one for urban and one for rural. Equal no. of sample hhs will be allocated. In this case, 55 hhs per village.
- One village to be selected in Pampanga is a resettlement area of victims of volcano eruption, which are suspected to have high incidence of difficulties. The rural village to be selected is a remote area in which the delivery of basic services is assumed to be inadequate thus contributing to several difficulties





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- For the selected villages, a cluster sampling of 5 sample hhs will be done
