STRUCTURE AND CONTENT OF COUNTRY INFRASTRUCTURE REPORTS

It should be noted that the following infrastructure sectors should to be included:

- **Transport** (roads, railways, air, water, urban);
- **Telecommunications**;
- **Power/energy**;
- **Water and sanitation**.

I. Preface: country profile:

- Geography; Political background; Population; Economic structure;
- Governmental structure: Form of the government.

II. Overall national development objectives:

- Long-term development objectives;
- Investment priorities.

III. National policies and strategies for infrastructure development:

- Overseas development aid, including expected sources and trends in funding;
- Role for private sector investment: Domestic, foreign, indication of private sector involvement;
- National PPP policy;
- Human resources development;
- Environmental, social and poverty issues;
- Strategies for supporting regional infrastructure development: Support and aid programmes for regional cooperation.

IV. Sectoral policies and scope/priorities of infrastructure programmes and projects:

- Sectoral policies, scope and priorities of programmes and projects in:
 - Telecommunications;
 - Power/energy;
 - Transport;
 - Water and sanitation;
 - Others;
- Investment programme summary tables:
 - A list of current and planned infrastructure projects by sector, anticipated start and finishing dates, their investment volume and anticipated modes and funding share of private participation;
 - National totals of current and planned investment by type and share of private sector funding.

V. Private Sector Participation:

- Market preparations for private sector investment: The legal and regulatory framework specific to infrastructure investment; Tax incentives for infrastructure investment; Tender/bidding regulations;
- Government commitment, support and risk management: General support facilities available to the private sector for investment in infrastructure;
- An explanation of the nature of the bidding and procurement process (e.g., flow charts explaining the process for bid selection);
- List of key government agencies responsible for Public-Private Partnerships in Infrastructure Development.
