SME measures ⁷ (last update 22 January 2021)	 Tax refund: Enterprises in the tourism sector must declare and pay their income taxes and social security contributions for the March quarter by 30 April 2020. The government will conduct assessments, if the enterprises are affected, they can be refunded taxes in the future. The government announced an economic stimulus plan totalling USD
	15 million, which was mainly used for wage subsidies and tax refunds in the tourism sector.

	• September 1, 2020: USD1.66 million Airport Improvement Program from the US Federal Aviation Administration. ¹⁴
