Fiscal	 April 30, 2020: Total stimulus: AUD 10.5 million (17.8% of GDP)³ Health: Spending on specialized medical equipment, enhanced laboratory capabilities, upgraded health facilities, and increased surveillance measures (AUD 5.6 million). Social Assistance: Emergency basic income (AUD 40) per person per month.⁴ Private sector: Support (AUD 0.3 million). Others: relocation to outer islands, repatriation of Tuvalu students studying abroad, maintenance of infrastructure for quarantine purposes (AUD 4.9 million). In addition, another \$200,000 allocated by Ministry of Finance from Supplementary Appropriation fund in order to finance other covid-19 measures. By end-November 2020, total COVID-19 related expenditure was A\$6.77 million (about 10% of GDP) of which health-related expenditure was A\$1.88 million.⁵
