






### Collective vision: shared ambition level (2)

... by 2030, national statistical systems are **enabled and empowered** to **lead** the development of and **deliver** innovative, trusted and timely products and services for urgently needed and evolving statistical requirements of Agenda 2030.







- Legal and institutional structures support application of FPOS
- "Clients at the center"

A mix of action: at the national level and collaborative activities involving stakeholders at all levels



# Framework for action: translates the vision into collaborative action at national, sub-regional and regional levels...

... to attain our collective vision for transformation, we need to take collective actions that will accelerate the needed transformation of the organizations, processes and people comprising national statistical systems



### Priority areas:

Advocacy; Investment; User engagement; Production and use of integrated statistics through methodological work, modernization of business processes & skills strengthening

### Collective action: principles (1)

Building on existing regional commitments

E.g. Regional programmes/strategies on Economic statistics, Agriculture and rural statistics; CRVS; Population & Social Statistics; Disaster-related statistics etc.

Building on national priorities and existing initiatives

Already supported by e.g. NSDS, tools for assessments, national quality assurance frameworks, generic statistics law etc.

Employing multiple implementation modalities E.g. Country-to-country exchange of expertise and experience, peer reviews, technical support, advisory services, training etc.

Multi-stakeholder engagement: complementation, collaboration and coordination

### **Adding value**

to ongoing and prospective national actions to hasten transformation of the NSS

### **Building on**

existing commitments to statistics development at national, sub-regional, regional and global levels Creating resources, designing activities and delivery mechanisms to attain the vision










 Conducting action research on costing statistical products








### Action area A: Engaging users and investing in statistics (2)

# Indicative regional resources that may be developed/promoted collaboratively

- Guidelines on data dissemination: access/use of data (incl. microdata)
- Guidelines on use of data for national SDGs progress reporting, incl. statistical analyses/ methodologies.
- Toolkit for user engagement: documented experiences, lessons learned, good practices, tools for statistical literacy
- Case studies on value of official statistics.
- Fundraising toolkit: national investment plans, estimating financial resources for basic range of statistics & statistical products/services, costbenefit analysis of increasing investments in NSS

# National actions/challenges identified e.g.







- Advocacy for sectoral support/understanding of statistics and need for monitoring of NDPs
- Complexities of coordination between relevant national agencies
- Need for micro-data hub
- Data access
- Financial resources


# Action area B: Assuring quality and instilling trust in statistics (1)


### **Objectives**

1.NSS have in **place legal frameworks** that accord appropriate **coordination authority & responsibility to NSO** and fully in line with / facilitates adherence to FPOS.

2.NSS, as national authority on statistics, formulate/implement comprehensive, system-wide and transformative strategies for development of statistics for progress monitoring of national development plans and the 2030 Agenda.

3.NSS have implemented a **system-wide quality assurance framework**.

- **Guidance material on** implementation of quality assurance frameworks.







# Challenges/needs identified in session 2 e.g.
