Challenges

- Data are decentralised.
- Inaccessibility of certain data because some of the data are treated as private and confidential for example human right of women and girls.
- Different time period of availability data (different cut off date).
- Inequality of definition used.

Measures taken

- a. Create a mechanism to collect and compile gender related data with inter agency and multi-sectoral collaboration.
 - A Technical Working Group (TWG) was set up by NSO and actively supported by other national organizations (data suppliers and users).
 - The objectives of this group also to coordinate co-operation and close the understanding gap between agencies especially on metadata and analysis.
- b. A few studies and analysis on gender related data are underway in order to improve the availability and quality of the data.

Future plans

- Develop central database for gender related data.
- Improve the level of data disaggregation.
- Coordinate the term used for gender statistics especially on gender data in tier 2 and 3.
- Attending seminar and courses related to gender statistics to improve capacity building.

Unmet needs from users side

- Participation in unenumerated productive work because the survey has been no follow-up.
- Data are not publish due to certain issues.
- Some secondary data does not meet the requirement of our national statistics department's needs for compilation, tabulation, disaggregation and dissemination.
- Some data are not available and applicable.
