History of ADB's PPP Support in Cambodia

PPPs have been implemented in Cambodia since 1990s, most as unsolicited

"Assessment of PPPs in Cambodia: Constraints and Opportunities",
carried out by ADB/AFD, published in 2012"

Project, approved on 19 Dec 2012, closed
29 June 2018

Looking Ahead to the Next Stage of PPP

Cambodia requires about \$12 - \$16 billion from 2013 to 2022 for new and improved infrastructure for its growing economy

2022 – 2032
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- a. Ministry of Public Works and Transport;
- b. Ministry of Mining and Energy;
- c. Phnom Penh Water Supply Authority;
- d. Ministry of Industries and Handicrafts;
- e. Phnom Penh Autonomous Port;
- f. Ministry of Land Management, Urban Planning and Construction;
- g. Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training;
- h. Ministry of Tourism; and
- i. Sihanoukville Autonomous Port

Ongoing PPP Framework Reformation

Law on PPP

- Approved by the Cabinet in Oct 2021
 - Replacing the Law on Concession
 - Aligned with international PPP practice

Standard Operating Procedures (SOP)

- Established to operationalize the Law on PPP
 - Provide guidance on how to identify, design, prepare, and develop PPP projects through the entire development cycle

Project Development Facility (PDF)

- Enables the government to prepare feasible PPP projects on its own
- Solicited proposals could be implemented

→ ADB offers support to expedite this process

Establishment and Operationalization of Project Development Facility

Develop PDF Unit's work plan and roadmap (SERD)

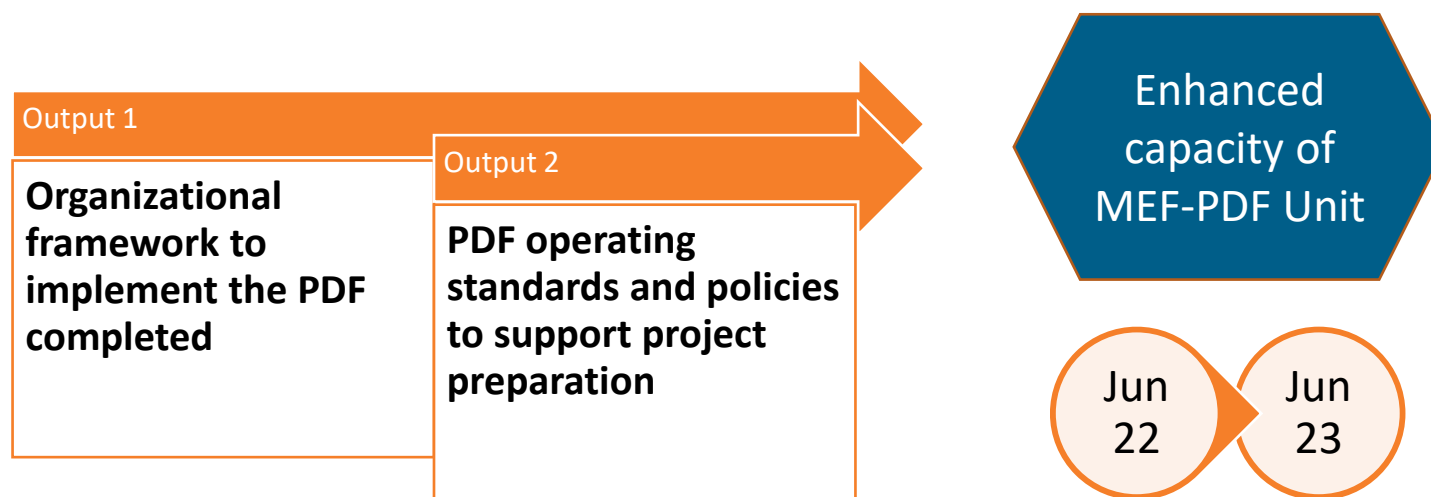
Develop operational guidelines of PDF (SERD)

Build a list of pipeline project for PDF (OPPP)

Capacity development for CPU on project screening and preparation (OPPP)

Support for the Operationalization of PDF

- ADB offers support through subproject under TA 6749



Capacity Building to Kick-start PDF Operations

- OP3P to provide Technical Assistance through the Asia Pacific Project Preparation Facility (AP3F).
- Consultants to be engaged by AP3F will approach each line ministry to ask their priorities and create a list of potential projects (at this stage, it is not determined whether projects would be procured under PPP modality).
- Conduct initial assessment of the potential projects and identify the ones that may be suitable for procurement under PPP modality.
- Recommend 2-5 projects to be considered by CPU for actual development.
- If some of these projects would proceed to the subsequent development phase, ADB to offer a separate transaction advisory service and associated capacity development on the project preparation.
