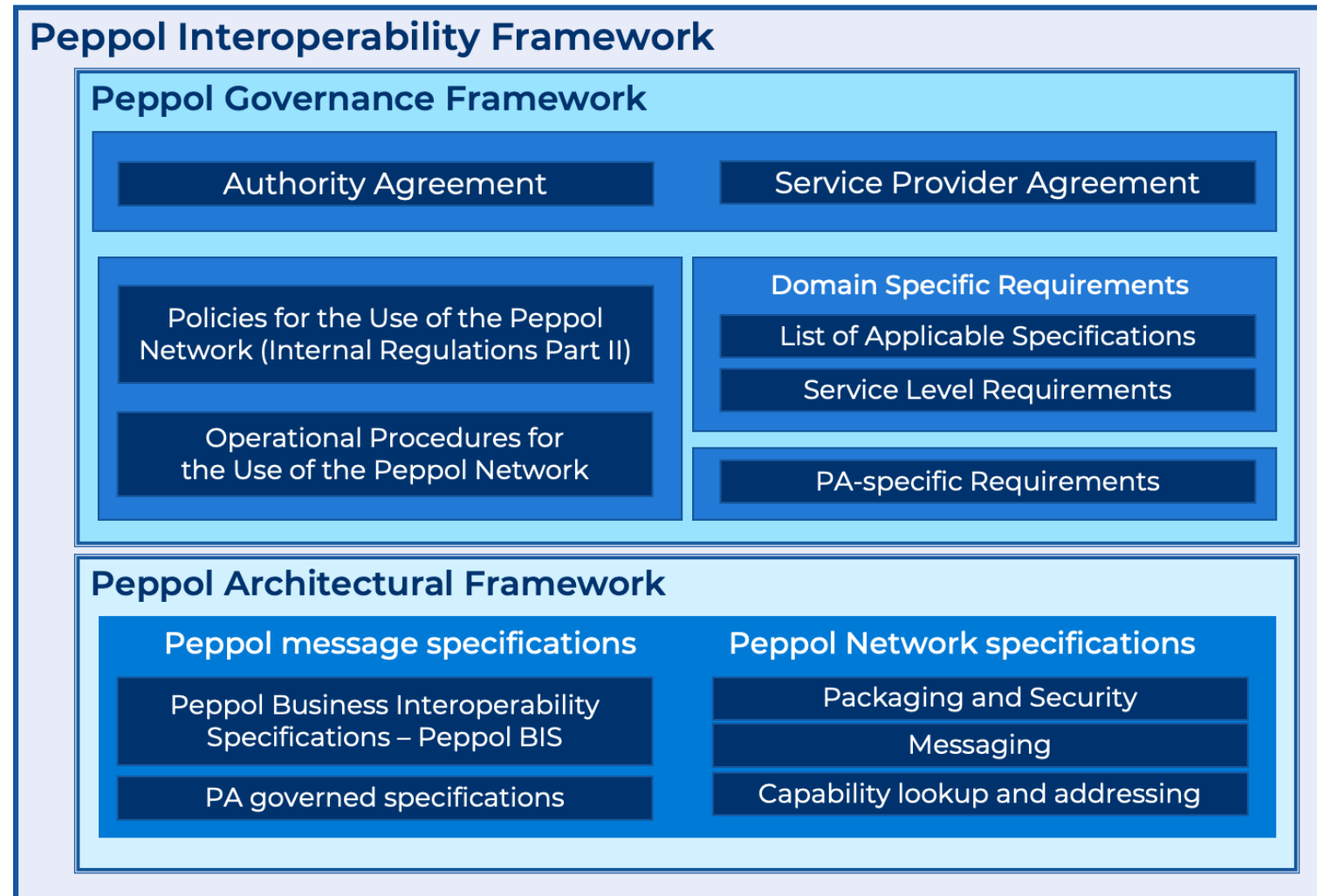

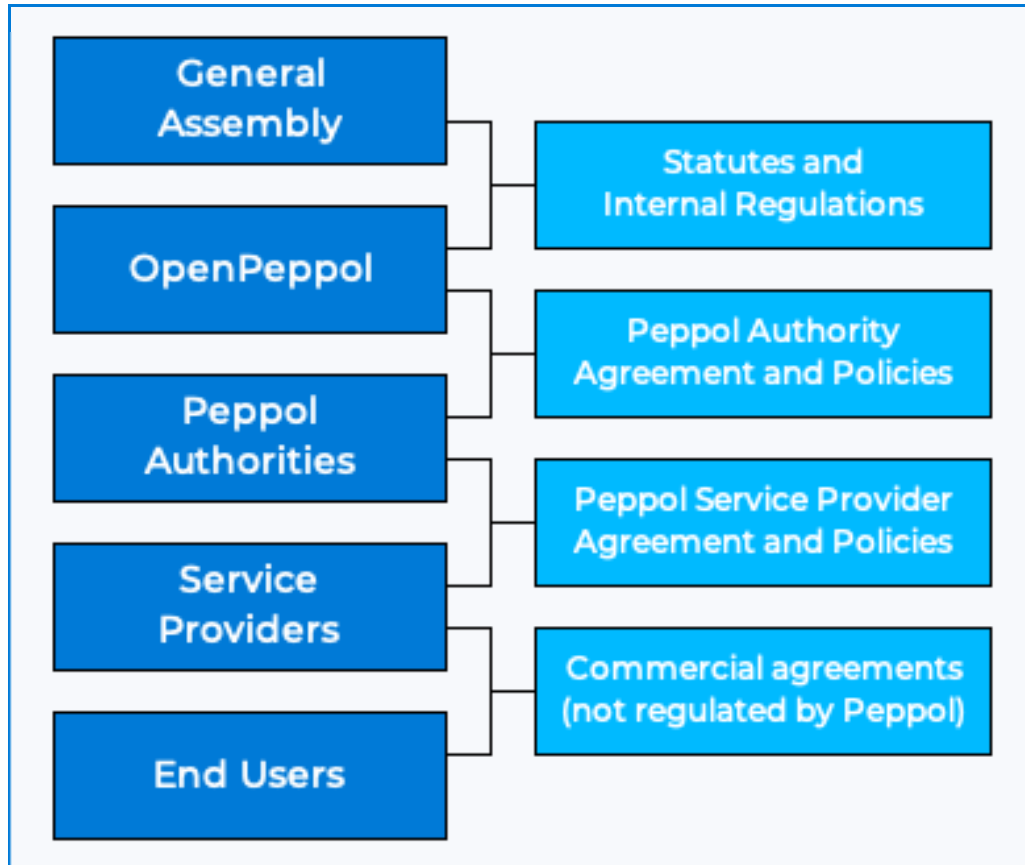

Peppol Interoperability Framework

- Based on 10 years of experience on what is needed for cross-sector and cross-border interoperability
- Development supported by public authorities and private service providers
- Supports business process interoperability for the electronic exchange of business documents
- Governance framework updated in 2022



OpenPeppol governance



OpenPeppol AISBL is a not-for-profit international association is based in Brussels and is established under Belgian law

OpenPeppol operates under a set of Statutes that are approved at the General Assembly by voting members of the Association and Internal Regulations approved by the Managing Committee

Each Peppol Authority operates under a standard bilateral legal agreement with OpenPeppol

Each Service Provider operates under a standard bilateral agreement with a Peppol Authority

Peppol services are provided to End Users under a commercial agreement with a Service Provider of their choice

Peppol International Invoice (PINT)

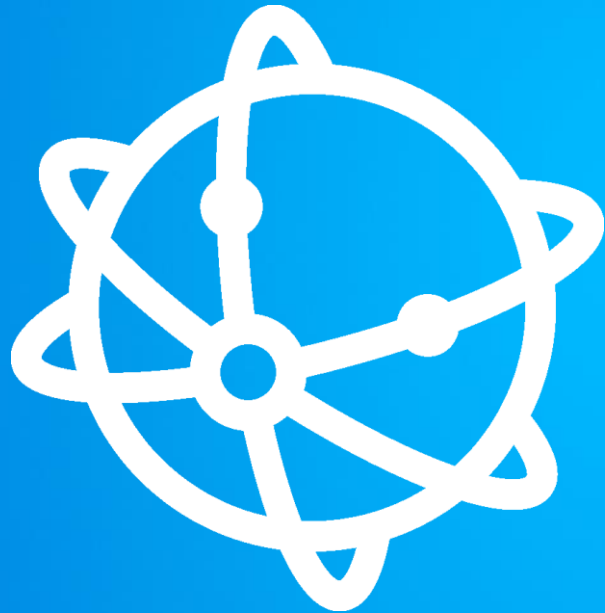
- Peppol BIS Billing 3.0 is the mandatory specification for invoices exchanged in the Peppol Network
- The specification is compliant with EN 16931, providing interoperability within the EU/EEA, and supporting cross-border exchange
- To cater for varying sales tax arrangements, jurisdiction-specific versions are used in Singapore, Australia and New Zealand
- To avoid the need for jurisdiction-specific versions to meet non-EU tax requirements, we developed the Peppol International Invoice (PINT)
- The PINT will facilitate the interoperable exchange of eInvoices across the Peppol Network at a global level

Next steps for PINT

- a revised model, with corresponding jurisdictional variants, has been developed for Australia, New Zealand and Singapore and will be tested in the playground
- a PINT-compliant invoice specification has been approved for Japan
- to confirm that the PINT specification can enable global interoperability across the Peppol Network, a Proof-of-Concept is under way using the testing playground
- PoC testing will conclude in Q4 2022 and PINT will be introduced from 2023
- a decision will be taken on the conditions under which PINT will be introduced as the next generation Peppol BIS

Why Peppol?

- Enables business efficiency through the open four-corner model
 - low barriers to entry for Service Providers and End Users
 - open market of Service Providers providing choice without lock-in
 - low cost, with no 'roaming' charges between Service Providers
- Facilitates interoperability within and between national jurisdictions
- Supports wider business document exchange, through an ever increasing range of business documents beyond Invoicing and Procurement
 - Logistics
 - Continuous Transaction Controls
- Peppol provides a shared language to do business in
 - No requirement for end-to-end testing
 - No need to maintain multiple systems and formats
 - Connect once, reach all
