Is capacity an obstacle for PPP development?

PPP transactions are complex

- ESCAP Survey: Perceptions of obstacles to PPPs

Obstacle	Percentage
Limited knowledge and capacity related to PPPs	40%
Lack of political will for promoting PPPs	22%
Unfavorable legal environment / Absence of clear rules	30%
Other	8%

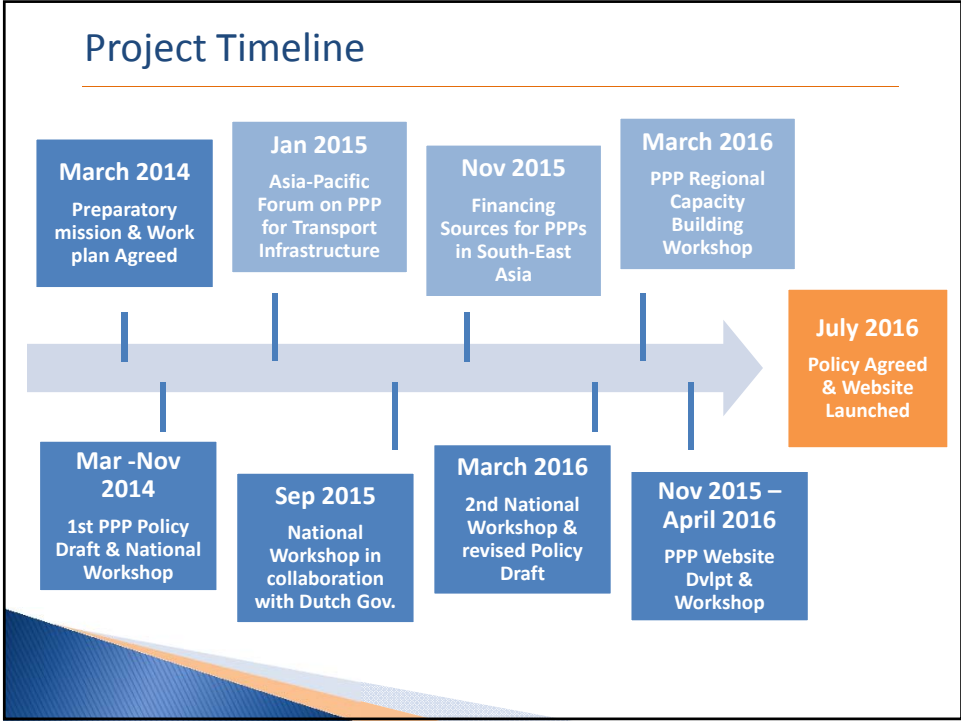
