Context

To fulfill obligations under the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development countries have committed to regular and inclusive review of progress towards achieving the Agenda and its Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) at the national and subnational levels.

An essential component of the review and implementation of the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs at the national level is the Voluntary National Review (VNR) process. All member States from the North and Central Asian subregion have already undergone at least one VNRs during the first five years of 2030 Agenda implementation: Armenia (2018, 2020); Azerbaijan (2017, 2019); Georgia (2016; 2020); Kazakhstan (2019); Kyrgyzstan (2020); Russia (2020); Tajikistan (2018); Turkmenistan (2019); Uzbekistan (2020). Processes of preparing VNRs provide an opportunity to share experiences, including challenges, best practices and lessons learnt, and facilitate acceleration of progress towards the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and SDGs.

This Session is a platform for follow-up and review at the subregional level. Through it, member States have a chance to revise national development goals and targets; assess and strengthen the adequacy of national policies and institutions; and mobilize multi stakeholder support through creation of partnerships for the achievement of the global goals.

The Session represents an opportunity to discuss among peers how to practically implement the guiding principles of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals. One core principle is “to leave no one behind” (LNOB), another to implement all SDGs through an integrated and comprehensive approach, and a third to consult and involve key stakeholders in a whole of society approach focusing on people, planet, prosperity, peace and partnership.

The COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting socio-economic crisis have magnified pre-existing challenges and vulnerabilities. It also reducing governments’ ability to act when support for poor, vulnerable and marginalized population groups is most needed. The impacts of the pandemic are, for example, deepening pre-existing gender inequalities and structural barriers, particularly in relation to women’s limited access to decent work, social protection systems, healthcare services, safe water and sanitation, decent work, and digital infrastructure.

What policy approaches are different governments considering/applying to ensure that “building back better” means more inclusive, resilient, and sustainable societies that leave no one behind? How have different sectors and levels within government, and stakeholders within society been meaningfully involved in the preparations of Voluntary National Reviews and in the implementation of the SDGs at national and local levels?

Session Objectives

As an objective this Session has to foster deepened and shared understanding between member States and other stakeholders in North and Central Asia on cross-border challenges and to accelerate the balanced implementation of the 2030 Agenda at the national and subregional levels to Build Back Better after COVID-19, taking into consideration the distinct vulnerabilities and needs, capacities and skills of different segments of society, including women and men. Main discussion points will feed into the 2021 sessions of the Asia Pacific Forum for Sustainable Development (APFSD) and the HLPF.

Guiding questions for the session

1. What is the current progress of North and Central Asian states in achieving the 2030 Agenda and SDGs in order to "Leave no one behind"?
2. How has the COVID-19 pandemic affected the ability of governments and other stakeholders to implement development that leaves no one behind? And looking forward: what solutions and opportunities do we have to engage with vulnerable groups?

3. Already pre-COVID-19 many governments were struggling to ensure financing for development. Since the COVID-19 crisis, fiscal space has reduced at the hour of great need – how can we finance SDG implementation after COVID-19?
4. How to practically promote gender equality and empowerment of women through SDG implementation?
