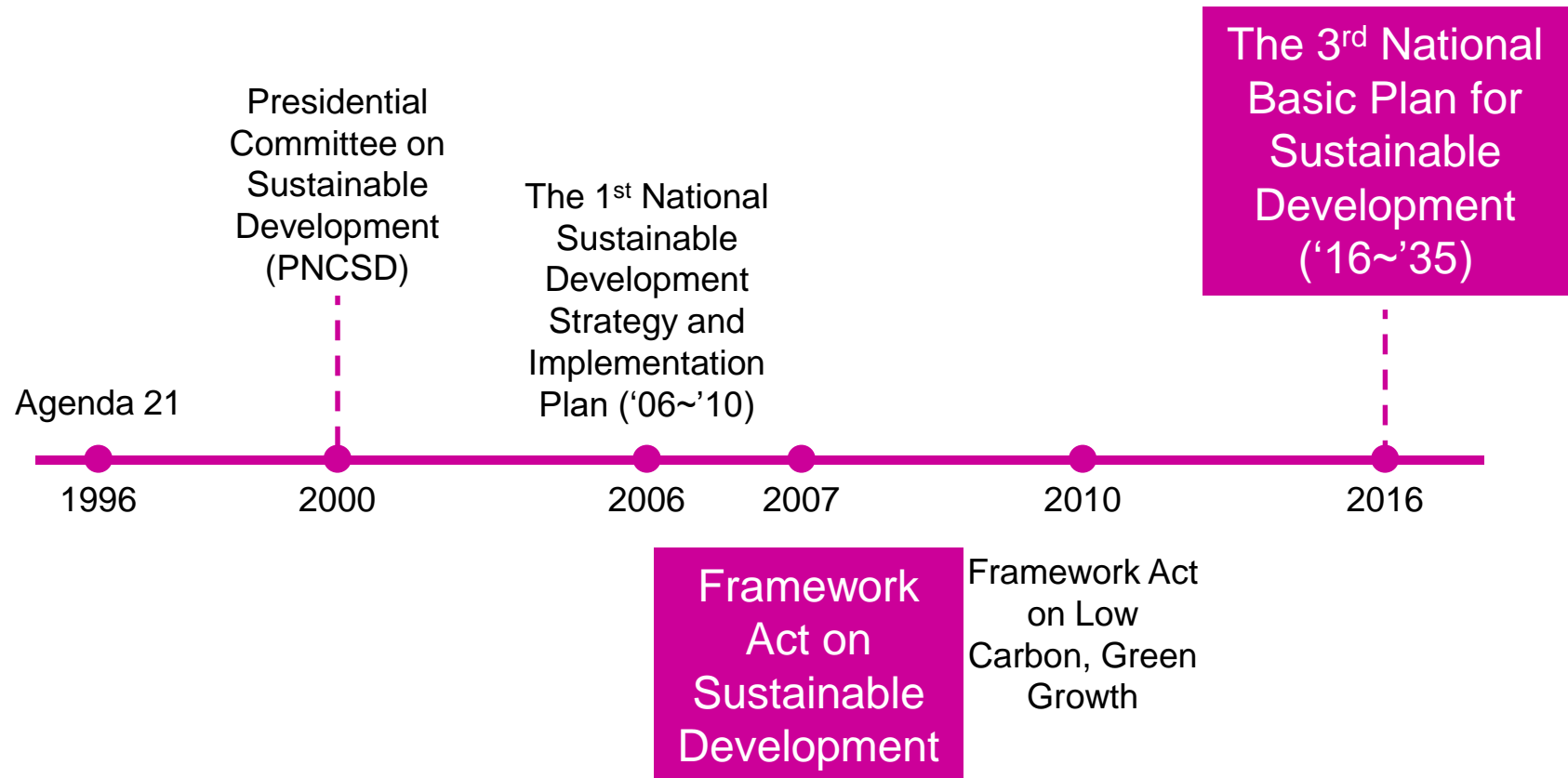

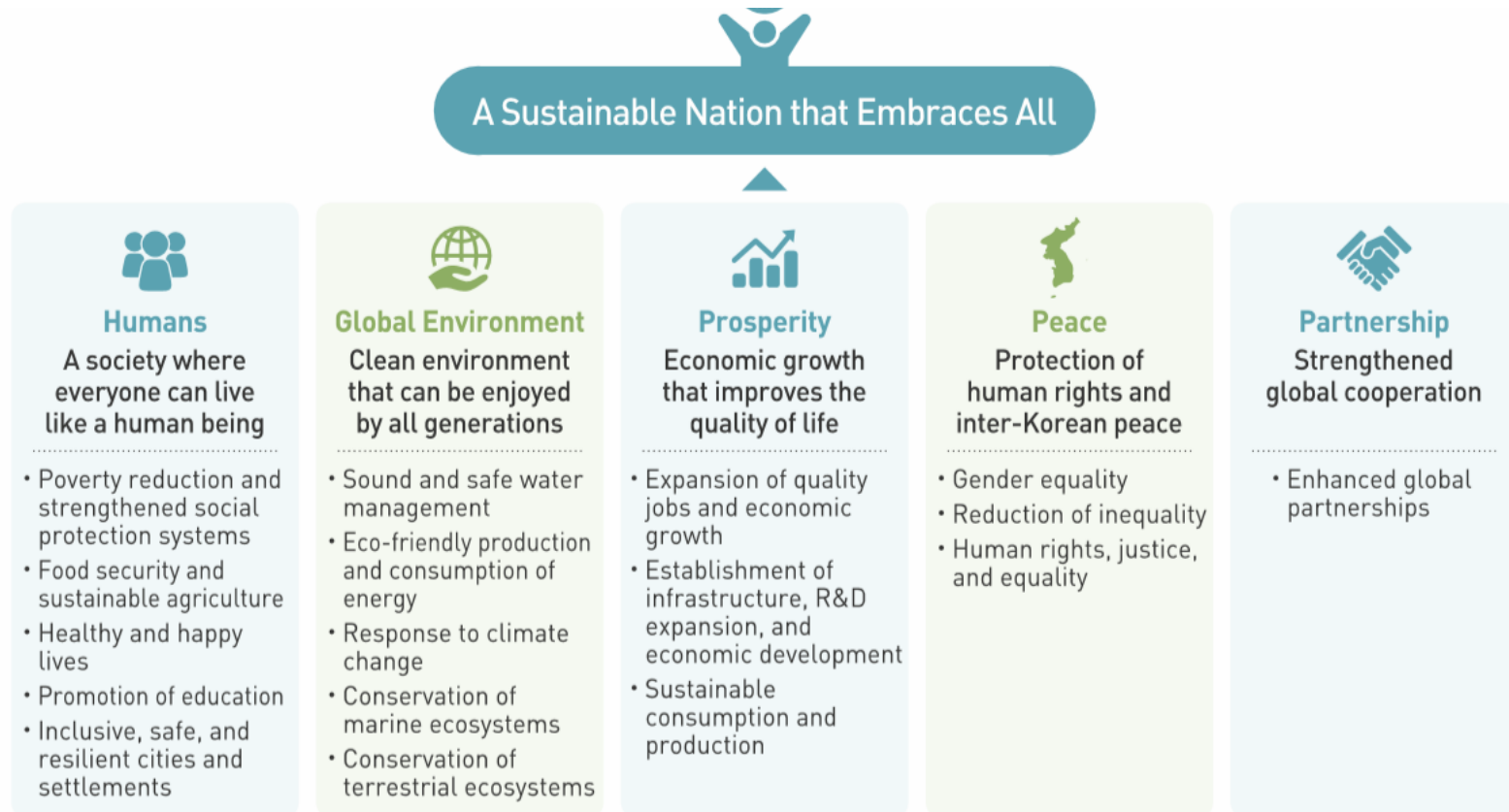

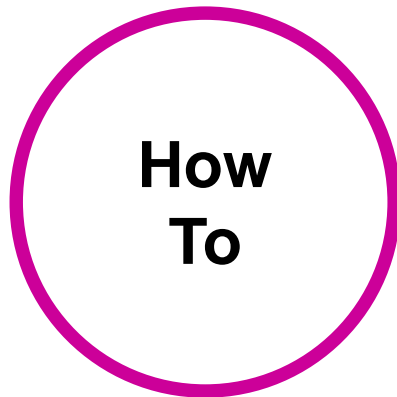

Current Administration's Vision and Goals to build "Inclusive State"



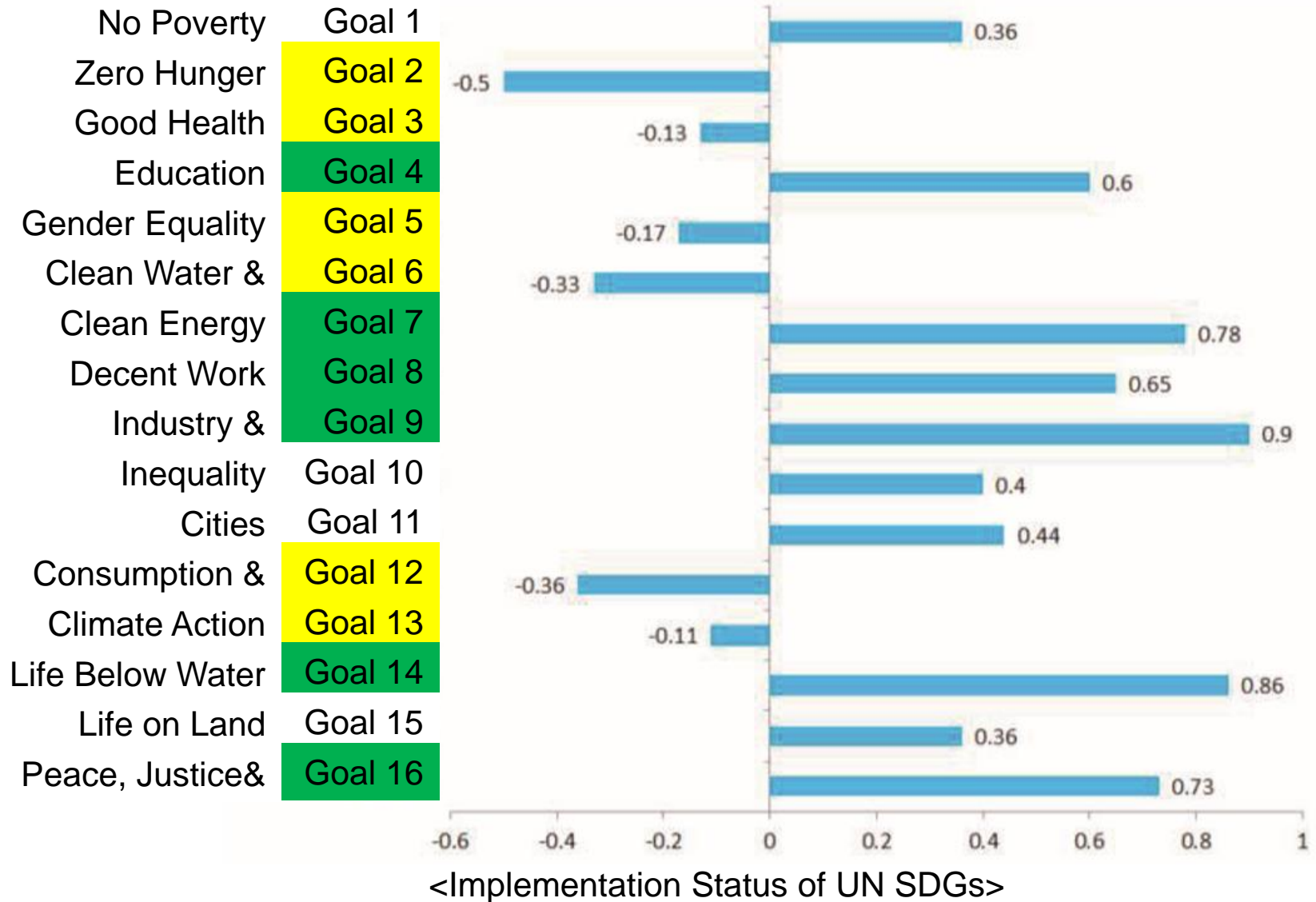
- Inclusive State: growing together through **innovation**, and everyone sharing in the benefits of growth through **inclusion**

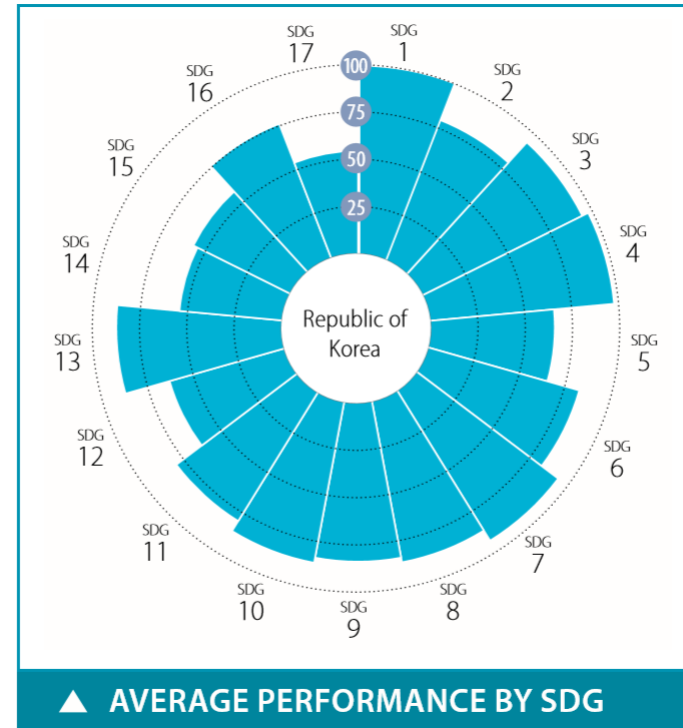
Index score

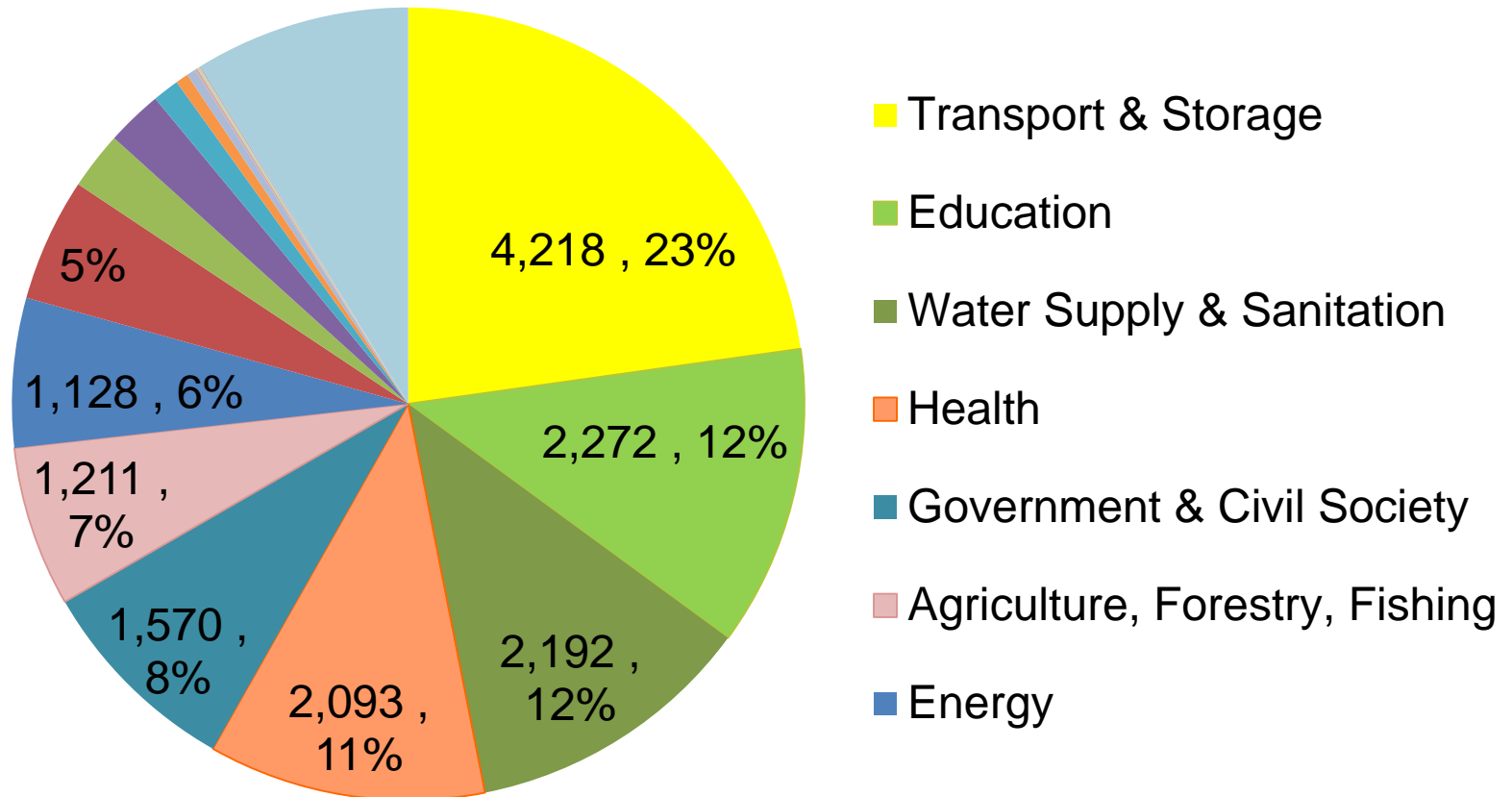
