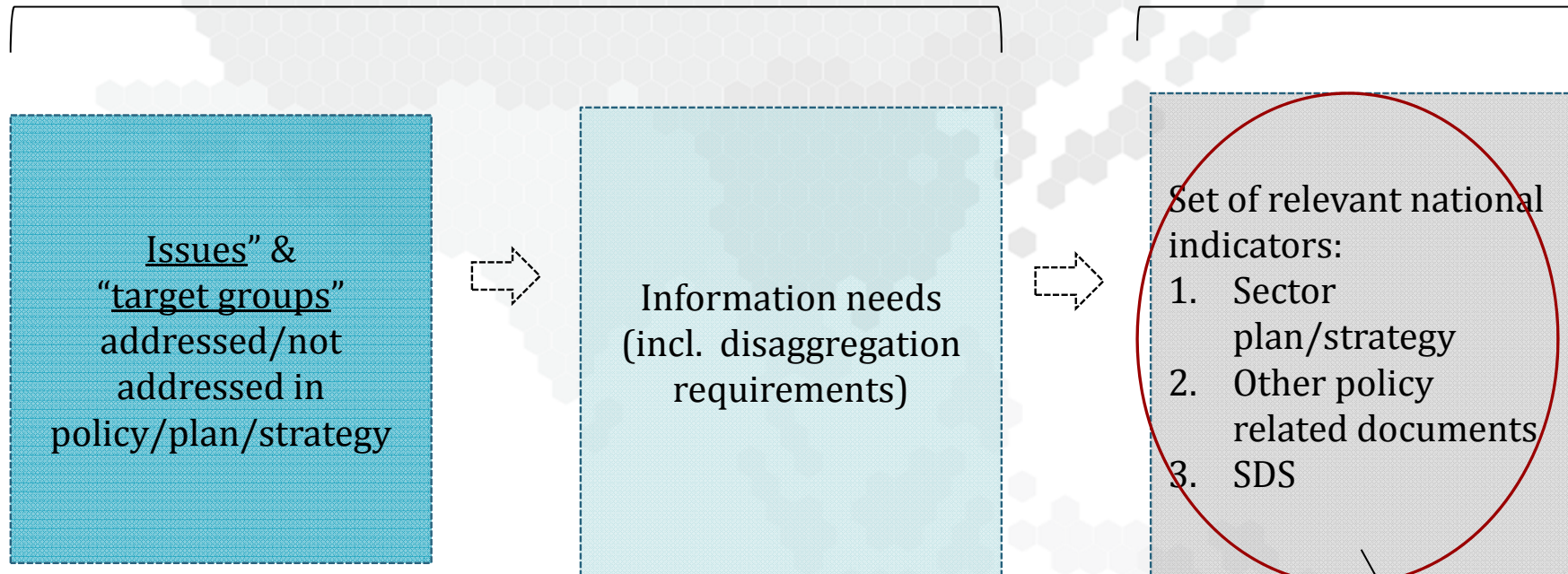

# National Sustainable Development Indicator Set (NSDIS): why?

- **Guide/specify information and data collection/compilation needed** in the country
- **Guide the overall statistical development needs** in the country, including the **design** of the National Strategy for the Development of Statistics (NSDS) (SDG 17.18.3) or the statistical master plan
- **Guide the setting of priorities** by national, regional and international entities in **enhancing the capacity** of national statistical systems
- Assist in meeting global and regional reporting requirements (including SDGs), by aligning national indicators to these frameworks



# Development of a comprehensive NSDIS...

Map/align national dev priorities  
to other dev frameworks



Collation of **indicators at national level**, driven by national policy priorities/targets:

- Sector plan/strategy
- Other policy related docs
- SDS

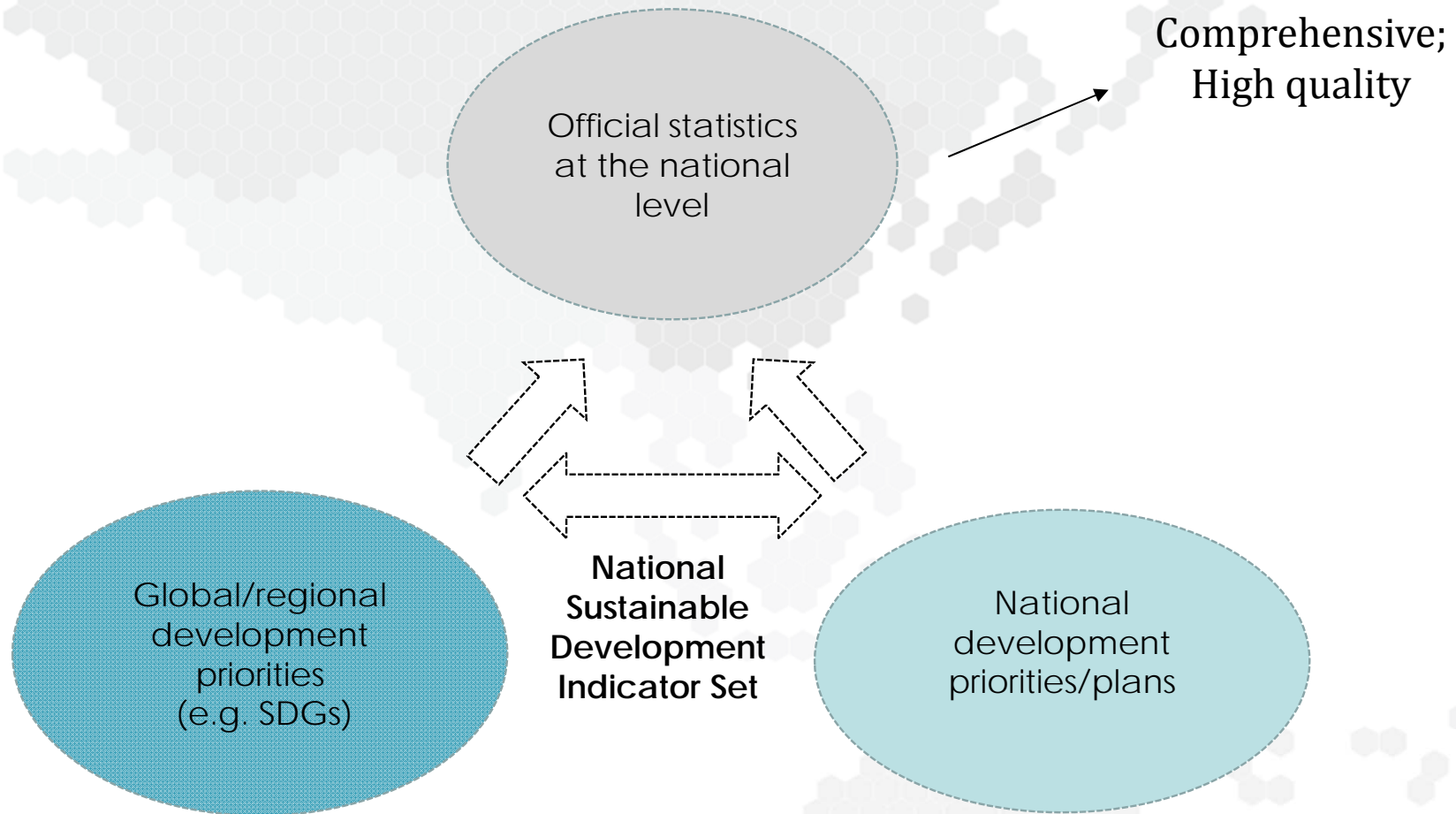

- **Global frameworks:** e.g. SDGs, Global Minimum Set of Gender Indicators etc.
- **Regional (A-P) frameworks:** E.g. Core Set of Economic Statistics; Regional Action Plan to improve Agricultural and Rural Statistics; Core Set of Gender Indicators in A-P
- **Sub-regional (Pacific) frameworks:** E.g. Pacific Roadmap for Sustainable Development Indicators; Healthy Islands Lifestyles; Framework for Pacific Regionalism; Pacific Regional Environment Indicators

# Development of NSDIS: stages

**1**

**Identify relevant existing national indicators from:**

1. Sector plan/strategy
2. Other policy related documents
3. SDS

***Done!***



**2**

Map national development priorities (“issues”) with indicators in relevant global/regional/sub-regional frameworks (SDG indicators and Pacific SD Indicators)



**3**

Check consistency between relevant existing national indicators and relevant indicators identified from SDGs/Pacific SD Indicator Set

(multiple scenarios!)



# Project work: Session 2.2

## Indicator mapping:

- Section 1: Transfer info from EPIC template
- Section 2: Map “issues” with SDG/Pac SD Indicators by simply entering indicator code in column “E”. Indicator will automatically appear
- Section 3: Check if there are inconsistencies between the national indicator and the corresponding SDG/Pacific SD Indicators and enter comments
- Section 4: Identify information gaps (if an issue has no indicator or only a partial match)

## ➤ Refer to:

- Full list of SDG and Pacific SD Indicators (with potentially relevant indicators highlighted for your sector)
- List of relevant SDG goals and targets for respective sector
- List of other global/regional/sub-regional indicator frameworks of relevance to continue indicator mapping work after this workshop

## Points to note...

- At the workshop:
  - Map “issues” with SDG/Pacific SD indicators
  - Check consistency of national indicators with SDG/Pacific SD indicators
  - Make proposals for any modification or generation of new indicators needed in the “comments” column
  - ***End result: Not a final NSDIS, but work-in-progress.***
  
- After the workshop:
  - Take up any proposed modification/generation of new indicators with careful consideration of international definitions, standards, classifications etc.
  - Complete mapping with other relevant global, regional, sub-regional frameworks
  - Finalize NSDIS (though will be an iterative process)
