
Roadmap on gender statistics in the Pacific

Step 1: Identify purpose and outcome

PURPOSE	A guiding framework to support Pacific National Statistical Systems to generate quality, relevant and timely gender data that meets users' needs to advance gender equality.
OUTCOME	QUALITY, RELEVANT AND TIMELY GENDER DATA THAT RESPONDS TO USERS NEEDS IS PRODUCED, AVAILABLE, DISSEMINATED AND EFFECTIVELY USED TO ADVANCE GENDER EQUALITY



	Provide guidelines to countries to assist in the process of identifying priority gender indicators	Enhance the availability, quality and relevance of gender data.	Data are transformed into statistical information together with the national context needed to understand them.	To communicate gender data effectively and in line with user's needs, to inform policy decisions, research and be useful for advocacy and accountability to achieve gender equality.	To design and implement a knowledge management system that is user friendly, promotes learning through a shared or open access platform and strengthens institutions.

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Step 5: Link specific activities to each strategic area

User-producer dialogues and surveys of users needs are organized annually in countries to cater to user’s needs and share information	Existing data is reprocessed to obtain estimates on sex-disaggregated (and multi-level disaggregated) SDG indicators	Data integration methods and non conventional sources are used to come up with gender estimates	Data is communicated in a targeted and user-friendly manner, including by using effective visualizations	Data producers organize training and learning activities for academicians, media and other potential users
Regional dialogues take place periodically to align priorities between countries	Training is provided to users and producers on specialized survey methods	New gender data is consistently anonymized and analyzed	Annual data dissemination plans are established, funded and implemented	The timeliness of data and metadata exchanges is enhanced, including with the international statistical system
