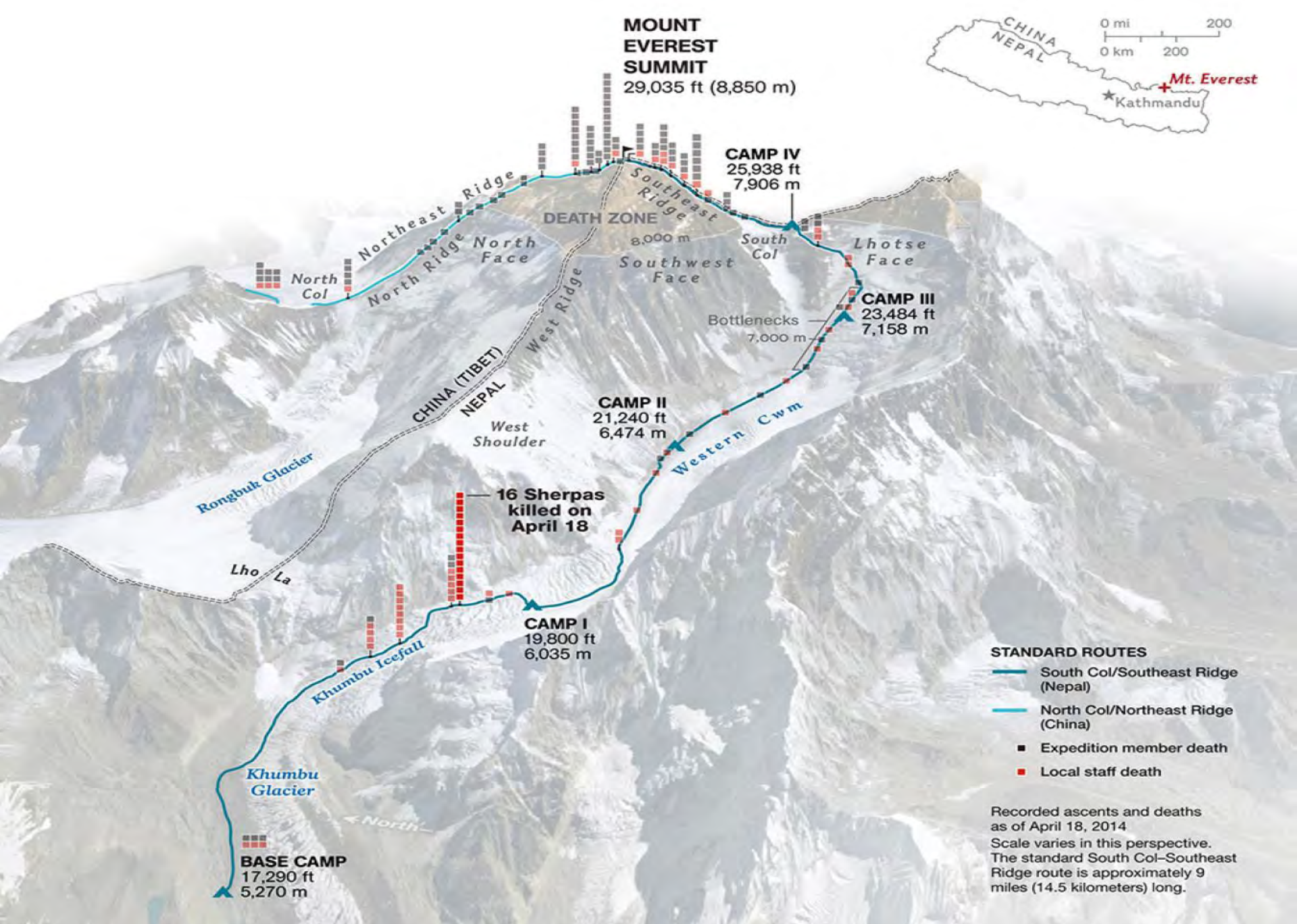

The standard South Col–Southeast Ridge route is approximately 9 miles (14.5 kilometers) long.



# Statistics & SDGs
