UHC – National Goals

- Achieve Universal Health Coverage for all by 2025 ensuring that all people can access the health services they need to become and stay healthy without suffering financial hardship.
- 80% of population covered by social health protection schemes by 2020
- Reduction of Out-of-Pocket expenditure to 30% by 2025

Health indicators

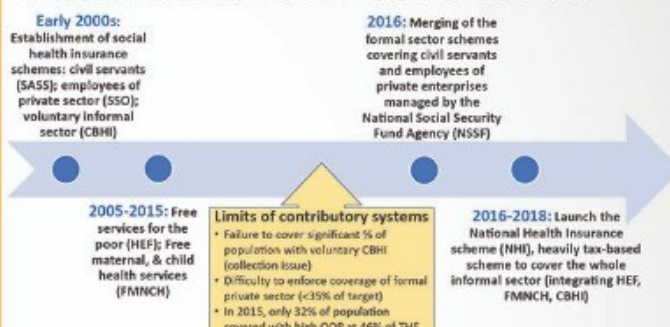


- Good progress on many health targets; identified 10 National Assembly indicators
- MNCH indicators remain challenging
 - US mortality rate: 86/1000 in 2015 remains the highest in Southeast Asia
 - Infant mortality rate: 48.1/1,000 in 2016 (target 45)
- Equity gap (socioeconomic status, rural-urban)
 - Children in the poorest quintile are 3.6 times more likely to die before reaching 5 compared to those in wealthiest quintile
 - Children born in Phongsavang province are 5 times more likely to die before reaching 5 than those born in Vientiane City
- Shift in disease burden: NCDs estimated to account for 60% of all deaths
- Low Health Service Utilization: 0.6 visits per person per year
- Out-of-pocket payments: 45.1% of Total Health Expenditure in 2015-16

Evolution of Social Health Protection Schemes

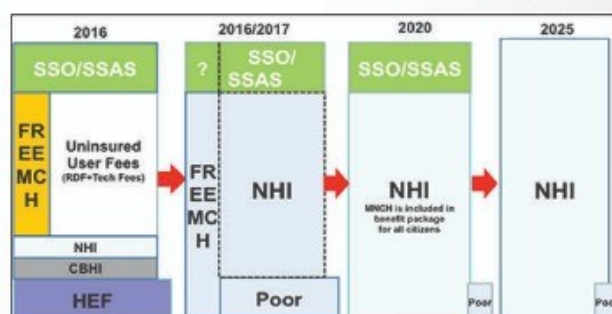


Current Social Health Protection system

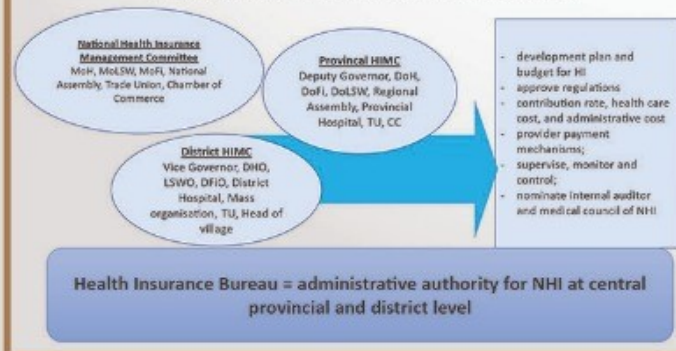
- Launch of the National Health Insurance (NHI) scheme end of 2016 with expansion to all provinces except Vientiane Capital in 2017 integrating the free health services for the poor (HEF), policy for free services for mothers and children under 5 (FMNCH) and voluntary health insurance (CBHI)
- For the formal sector: contributory system based on remuneration. No co-payment at point of use (managed by NSSF/MoLSW)
- For the informal sector: Mainly tax-based system whereby the NHI pays services to health facilities with low lumpsum co-payment by the patient when using health service, except the poor, Children under 5 and mothers who are exempted:
(Managed by NHIB/MoH)
