Summary

The present report has been prepared by the secretariat to help the Interim Intergovernmental Steering Group on Cross-border Paperless Trade Facilitation review progress made in preparing a draft road map for the implementation of substantive provisions in the draft text of the regional arrangement for the facilitation of cross-border paperless trade and discuss next steps in continuing the preparation.

**I. Approaches taken in preparing a draft road map for the
implementation of substantive provisions in the draft text
of the regional arrangement for the facilitation of cross-
border paperless trade**

1. The Legal and Technical Working Groups, in particular the Technical Working Group, have been preparing a draft road map for the implementation of substantive provisions in the draft text of the regional arrangement for the facilitation of cross-border paperless trade since their operation began in September 2015, while the Legal Working Group has concentrated on improving the draft text of the regional arrangement.

2. In preparing the draft road map, the Technical Working Group noted that article 13 of the current version of the draft text of the regional arrangement for the facilitation of cross-border paperless trade (E/ESCAP/PTA/IISG(2)/2) requested the Standing Committee to develop a comprehensive action plan, which should include all concrete actions and measures with clear targets and implementation timelines necessary for creating a consistent, transparent and predictable environment for the implementation of the [Framework] Agreement including the implementation schedules of the respective parties. Working Group also noted that the draft road map and associated deliverables were documents aimed at supporting the development of a comprehensive action plan and would remain drafts until after the regional arrangement came into force, at which point parties to the arrangement (namely, Members that had signed and ratified it) would meet and finalize them as they saw fit. Guides, templates, terms of reference and other supporting documents developed by the Working Group as part of the preparation of the draft road map may serve as reference material for all interested stakeholders.

3. The Technical Working Group started by reviewing the substantive provisions in the current draft text to derive actions implied by them. The derived actions are listed below.

II. Key features

4. The Technical Working Group organized the draft road map according to the structure of the current draft text of the regional arrangement and included the following information for each substantive provision:

- (a) Objectives and actions, as specified in the relevant articles;
- (b) Tasks and subtasks, oriented toward achieving each action;
- (c) Target outcome for each action;

- (d) Roles/responsibilities of the parties and the secretariat:
- (i) Collective: tasks to be performed jointly by all the parties together with the support of the secretariat;
 - (ii) Individual: tasks to be implemented by each party;
- (e) Relative priority: high, medium and low.

5. The Technical Working Group tentatively identified the priority of tasks with collective responsibility. The following table shows the draft road map with the featured information.

IV. Consideration by the Steering Group

7. The Interim Intergovernmental Steering Group on Cross-border Paperless Trade Facilitation may consider undertaking the following:

(a) Review the progress made so far, including the work done by the 3rd meeting of the Legal and Technical Working Groups from 21 to 23 March 2016;

(b) Discuss next steps for making further progress, including defining timelines and priorities for tasks with collective responsibility;

(c) Identify additional sources of funds and other resources for the preparation of the draft road map and related supporting documents for cross-border paperless trade facilitation. Noting with appreciation the trust fund established by the Republic of Korea in 2013 to support trade facilitation, including implementation of Commission resolution 68/3 and the work of the Steering Group under Commission resolution 70/6, the Steering Group may call upon other members also to consider contributing financially or in kind to this effort, to build capacity and facilitate the engagement of less developed countries.
